Please upload a brief (i.e., one page or less) letter from your institution in PDF format (i) confirming that you are the institution's selected applicant, (ii) confirming that you hold a faculty appointment (or other long-term research position outside a university) that allows at least 50 percent of your effort to perform research, and (iii) briefly describing the institution's

applicant selection process. While this letter is required, its contents will not be considered as part of the LOI review process.

As detailed in the RFP, only one applicant from a university or non-profit research institute will be considered in each application cycle. For purposes of this limitation, the Foundation considers the overseeing university to be the institution. Thus, a university with a law school, medical school, several teaching hospitals, and a faculty of arts and sciences may only submit one application in total. If a university system, such as a state-wide university system, comprises several universities, each university within the system may nominate one applicant.
